

MARKET SUMMARY FOR NOVEMBER

The Producer Price Differential (P.P.D.) for milk delivered to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) of the Southwest Milk Market Order was \$2.25 for November. Butterfat price decreased \$0.2014 per pound from \$2.4436 in October to the level of \$2.2422 in November. Protein price decreased \$0.2758 per pound from \$2.4739 in October to \$2.1981 in November. November's Other Solids price increased \$0.0034 per pound from \$0.1763 in October to \$0.1797 in November. The Somatic Cell Count adjustment rate factor for November was 0.00081 per thousand (difference from 350).

For comparison in hundredweights, producers who delivered milk to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) received a November statistical uniform price of \$17.69 per hundredweight for milk testing 3.5% butterfat, 2.99% true protein, 5.69% other solids and 350,000 SCC. This is a decrease of \$0.63 in comparison to the statistical uniform price of \$18.32 in October.


The November Class I price increased \$0.66 from \$19.58 in October to the November level of \$20.24. The Class II price for November of \$17.21 per hundredweight decreased \$0.36 from \$17.57 in October. November's Class III price increased \$1.50 from \$16.94 in October to \$15.44 in November. The Class IV price decreased \$0.47 from \$17.15 in October to \$16.68 in November.

In November 546 producers delivered a total of 900,947,254 pounds of milk. On a daily basis this represents a decrease of 0.22 percent from the producer receipts level in October but it represents an increase of 81.60 percent when compared to the producer receipts level of November 2009.

Producer milk classified as Class I during November amounted to 42.79 percent of total producer receipts. This figure is up from 40.62 percent in October but it is down from 72.13 percent in November 2009. The average butterfat test of producer milk pooled during November was 3.785 percent, average protein test was 3.190 percent, average other solids test was 5.785 percent and the average somatic cell count was 204.000.

USDA NAMES MEMBERS TO THE NATIONAL DAIRY BOARD

Agriculture Secretary Thomas J. Vilsack has announced the appointment of 12 members to the National Dairy Promotion and Research Board. All appointees will serve three-year terms.

"These appointees represent a diverse cross section of the dairy industry and I am confident that they will serve dairy producers throughout the United States well," said Vilsack.

Newly appointed members are: Renae A. De Jager, Region 2 (California); Jeffrey A. Hardy, Region 3 (Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Utah, and Wyoming); Steven R. Hanson, Region 4 (Arkansas, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas); Douglas T. Danielson, Region 6 (Wisconsin); Douglas L. Krickenbarger, Region 9 (Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and West Virginia); Zachary H. Myers, Region

10 (Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia); David P. Crowl, Region 11 (Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania); and Sanf ord Stauffer, Region 12 (New York).

Reappointed members are: James L. Ahlem, Region 2; John B. Fiscalini, Region 2; Stephen D. Maddox, Region 2; and Brad J. Scott, Region 2.

The National Dairy Promotion and Research Board oversees the collection of the mandatory 15-cent per hundredweight assessment on all milk marketed commercially by dairy producers. In addition, the board develops and administers a coordinated program of promotion, research, and nutrition education.

The board is authorized by the Dairy Production Stabilization Act of 1983. The Agriculture Secretary selects the appointees from nominations by dairy producers and farm organizations.




