MARKET SUMMARY FOR SEPTEMBER

The Producer Price Differential (PPD) for milk delivered to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) of the Southwest Milk Market Order was \$0.22 for September. Butterfat price decreased \$0.0567 per pound from \$2.6009 in August to the level of \$2.5442 in September. Protein price increased \$0.3784 per pound from \$1.6245 in August to \$2.0029 in September. The Other Solids price increased \$0.0357 per pound from \$0.1741 in August to \$0.2098 in September. The Somatic Cell Count Adjustment rate factor for September was 0.00083 per thousand (difference from 350).

For comparison in hundredweights, producers who delivered milk to handlers located in Dallas/ Tarrant counties (TX) received a September statistical uniform price of \$16.31 for milk testing 3.5% butterfat, 2.99% true protein, 5.69% other solids and 350,000 SCC. This is an increase of \$0.35 in comparison to the statistical uniform price of \$15.96 in August.

The September Class I price increased \$0.70 from \$17.15 in August to the September level of \$17.85. The Class II price increased \$0.06 from \$15.07 in August to \$15.13 in September. The Class III price increased \$1.14 from \$14.95 in August to \$16.09 in September. The Class IV price increased \$0.18 from \$14.63 in August to \$14.81 in September.

In September, 444 producers delivered a total of 755,861,186 pounds of milk. On a daily basis, this represents a decrease of 39.29% from the producer receipts level in August and it represents a decrease of 36.72% when compared to the producer receipts level of September 2017.

Producer milk classified as Class I during September amounted to 45.77% of total producer receipts. This figure is up from 28.08% in August and is up from 30.24% in September 2017. The average butterfat test of producer milk pooled during September was 3.912%, average protein test was 3.204%, average other solids test was 5.753% and the average somatic cell count was 229,000





Market Administrator's Report

July Milk Sales

During July 2018, 3.6 billion pounds of packaged fluid milk products are estimated to have been sold in the United States. This was 2.2 percent lower than July 2017. Estimated sales of total conventional fluid milk products decreased 2.6 percent from July 2017 and estimated sales of total organic fluid milk products increased 4.3 percent from a year earlier.


August Milk Production

Milk production in the 23 major States during August totaled 17.2 billion pounds, up 1.4 percent from August 2017. July revised production, at 17.3 billion pounds, was up 0.5 percent from July 2017. The July revision represented an increase of 16 million pounds or 0.1 percent from last month's preliminary production estimate.

Production per cow in the 23 major States averaged 1,974 pounds for August, 28 pounds above August 2017. This is the highest production per cow for the month of August since the 23 State series began in 2003.

The number of milk cows on farms in the 23 major States was 8.74 million head, 3,000 head less than August 2017, but 4,000 head more than July 2018.
