

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MARKET SUMMARIES FOR OCTOBER

The October Class III price increased 4 cents from the previous month to \$12.83. The Class II price for October of \$12.37 per hundredweight increased \$1.21 from \$11.16 in September. September's Class III-A price increased \$1.63 from September's level to \$13.50.

Texas: Producers who delivered milk to handlers located in Zones 1 and 2 of the Texas Milk Market Order received \$14.21 per hundredweight for deliveries of milk containing 3.5% butterfat. The October price was up \$1.03 from September.

Producers delivered a total of 517,567,717 pounds of milk during October. On a daily basis this represents an increase of 26.03 percent from the producer receipts level in September and it represents an increase of 11.68 percent when compared to the producer receipts level of October 1996.

Producer milk classified as Class I during October amounted to 55.89 percent of total producer receipts. This figure is down from September's 69.31 percent and it is down from 62.60 percent in October 1996. The average butterfat test of producer milk pooled during October 1997 was 3.593 percent.

New Mexico - West Texas: Producers who delivered milk to handlers located in Zone 1 of the New Mexico - West Texas Milk Market Order received \$13.56 per hundredweight for deliveries of milk containing 3.5% butterfat. The October price was up 61 cents from its September level.

Producers delivered a total of 132,304,407 pounds of milk during October. On a daily basis this represents an increase of 11.47 percent from the producer receipts level in September but it represents a decrease of 36.26 percent when compared to the producer receipts level of October 1996.

Producer milk classified as Class I during October amounted to 43.63 percent of total producer receipts. This figure is down from 49.46 percent in September but it is up from 28.54 percent in October 1996. The average butterfat test of producer milk pooled during October 1997 was 3.562 percent.

CLASS I DIFFERENTIALS RULED "ILLEGAL"

The Fourth U.S. District Court of Minnesota Judge David S. Doty on November 3 ruled that the Class I milk price differentials in 28 surplus and balanced milk marketing orders unlawful, which includes the Texas and New Mexico - West Texas milk marketing orders. The ruling also applies to any deficit milk orders that does not rely directly or indirectly on alternative milk supplies from the Upper Midwest orders. Judge Doty further ruled that USDA "is enjoined from enforcing these differentials".

USDA has announced that it has asked the Department of Justice to seek a stay of the November 3, 1997, ruling. The stay would allow time for USDA to make an evaluation of the Court's decision.

This ruling marks the fourth such proceeding in this suit. Judge Doty's decision came in a lawsuit filed originally in 1990 by the Minnesota Milk Producers Association challenging to invalidate much of the nation's system of pricing milk. In its first ruling in 1994, the Minneapolis Court held the Secretary of Agriculture's decision to be "arbitrary and capricious" and gave the Secretary a 120 days to explain his basis for retaining Class I differentials. In May of 1996, the Court again ruled against the USDA, contending that the Secretary still had not provided evidence of how he arrived at Class I differentials. The

Court remanded this matter for a second time to the Secretary so he could, rather than simply restating his decision to retain the differentials, make such findings and conclusions as reflect reasoned consideration of the factors concerning the details of how the current differentials had been arrived at. The Court also remanded the case because the Secretary had not complied with the Court's initial order that the Secretary consider the relevant factors with respect to the use of M-W price, specifically how the M-W reflects market-specific economic decisions.

The Secretary's second amplified decision was

issued September 10, 1996, and on March 3, 1997, Minnesota Milk Producers Association brought this, their fourth motion for summary judgement. Given this background, Judge Doty decided not to remand the decision back to the Secretary for a third amplified decision. Instead, he enjoined the Secretary from enforcing the Class I differentials. As of November 13 USDA had not responded to the federal judge's ruling.

It may take some time before the specific impacts of this ruling is fully known.




