MARKET SUMMARY FOR JUNE

The Producer Price Differential (P.P.D.) for milk delivered to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) of the Southwest Milk Market Order was \$1.58 for June. Butterfat price increased \$0.0064 per pound from \$1.1512 in May to the level of \$1.1576 in June. Protein price increased \$0.0159 per pound from \$1.9275 in May to \$1.9434 in June. June's Other Solids price decreased \$0.0056 per pound from negative \$0.0144 in May to a negative \$0.0200 in June. The Somatic Cell Count adjustment rate factor for June was .00057 per thousand (difference from 350).

For comparison in hundredweights, producers who delivered milk to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) received a June statistical uniform price of \$11.33 per hundredweight for milk testing 3.5% butterfat, 2.99% true protein, 5.69% other solids and 350,000 SCC. This is an increase of \$0.03 in comparison to the statistical blend price of \$11.30 in May.


The June Class I price increased \$0.03 cents

from \$12.71 in May to the June level of \$12.74. The Boston Class I price of \$12.99 produced a dairy deficiency payment of \$1.78 for June. The Class II price for June of \$10.46 per hundredweight increased \$0.03 from \$10.43 in May. June's Class III price increased \$0.04 from \$9.71 in May to \$9.75 in June. The Class IV price increased \$0.02 from \$9.74 in May to \$9.76 in June.


In June 948 producers delivered a total of 884,591,643 pounds of milk. On a daily basis this represents a decrease of 4.12 percent from the producer receipts level in May but it represents an increase of 5.42 percent when compared to the producer receipts level of June 2002.

Producer milk classified as Class I during June amounted to 34.87 percent of total producer receipts. This figure is down from 35.59 percent in May and it is down from 36.00 percent in June 2002. The average butterfat test of producer milk pooled during June was 3.501 percent, average protein test was 2.944 percent, average other solids test was 5.733 percent and the average somatic cell count was 312,000.




