MARKET SUMMARY FOR JANUARY

The Producer Price Differential (P.P.D.) for milk delivered to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) of the Southwest Milk Market Order was \$2.72 for January. Butterfat price decreased \$0.1914 per pound from \$1.2998 in December to the level of \$1.1084 in January. Protein price decreased \$1.2752 per pound from \$3.6390 in December to \$2.3638 in January. January's Other Solids price decreased (\$0.0035) per pound from (\$0.0269) in December to (\$0.0304) in January. The Somatic Cell Count adjustment rate factor for January was 0.00065 per thousand (difference from 350).

For comparison in hundredweights, producers who delivered milk to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) received a January statistical uniform price of \$13.50 per hundredweight for milk testing 3.5% butterfat, 2.99% true protein, 5.69% other solids and 350,000 SCC. This is a decrease of \$1.25 in comparison to the statistical blend price of \$14.75 in December.

The January Class I price increased \$0.31 from \$18.43 in December to the January level of \$18.74. The Class II price for January of \$10.41 per hundredweight decreased \$0.80 from \$11.21 in December. January's Class III price decreased \$4.50 from \$15.28 in December to \$10.78 in January. The Class IV price decreased \$0.76 from \$10.35 in December to \$9.59 in January.



In January 568 producers delivered a total of 1,088,983,537 pounds of milk. On a daily basis this represents a decrease of 80.31 percent from the producer receipts level in December and it represents an increase of 30.57 percent when compared to the producer receipts level of January 2008.

Producer milk classified as Class I during January amounted to 34.82 percent of total producer receipts. This figure is down from 60.77 percent in December and it is down from 44.77 percent in January 2008. The average butterfat test of producer milk pooled during January was 3.688 percent, average protein test was 3.136 percent, average other solids test was 5.711 percent and the average somatic cell count was 222,000.




