The Class I price for the Texas Marketing Area is the basic formula price for the second preceding month plus \$3.16, subject to the zone adjustment for that location.

For information only, the Class I & II prices for the Texas Order would have been 18.95 and 16.09, respectively, for October 1999. Also, the Class I & II prices for the New Mexico-West Texas Order would have been 18.14 and 16.09, respectively, for October 1999. The October 1999 Class I price and Class II skim milk price for the Southwest Order will be issued on September 17, 1999. However, should Congressional action or legal challenge delay the implementation of the consolidation and reform of the Federal milk order program as required by the 1996 Farm Bill, then the Class I & II prices in the first two sentences of this footnote will be applicable.

The processor assessment is an obligation under the Fluid Milk Promotion Order (7 CFR § 1160.101 et seq.). The Order requires that all persons who process and market more than 500,000 pounds of fluid milk products in consumer-type packages in the contiguous 48 States of the continental United States and the District of Columbia be assessed 20 cents per hundredweight on all marketing of such packaged fluid milk products during the month.

The Class I price for the New Mexico-West Texas Marketing Area is the basic formula price for the second preceding month plus \$2.35, subject to the zone adjustment for that location.
