

MARKET SUMMARY FOR SEPTEMBER

The Producer Price Differential (P.P.D.) for milk delivered to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) of the Southwest Milk Market Order was \$2.18 for September. Butterfat price increased \$0.0783 per pound from \$1.7413 in August to the level of \$1.8196 in September. Protein price decreased \$0.3808 per pound from \$3.6497 in August to \$3.2689 in September. September's Other Solids price decreased \$0.0295 per pound from \$0.0529 in August to \$0.0234 in September. The Somatic Cell Count adjustment rate factor for September was 0.00089 per thousand (difference from 350).

For comparison in hundredweights, producers who delivered milk to handlers located in Dallas/Tarrant counties (TX) received a September statistical uniform price of \$18.46 per hundredweight for milk testing 3.5% butterfat, 2.99% true protein, 5.69% other solids and 350,000 SCC. This is a decrease of \$0.86 in comparison to the statistical blend price of \$19.32 in August.

The September Class I price decreased \$0.82 from \$21.47 in August to the September level of \$20.65. The Class II price for September of \$17.58 per hundredweight increased \$0.13 from \$17.45 in August. September's Class III price decreased \$1.04 from \$17.32 in August to \$16.28 in September. The Class IV price decreased \$1.19 from \$16.64 in August to \$15.45 in September.

In September 577 producers delivered a total of 900,616,454 pounds of milk. On a daily basis this represents an increase of 0.43 percent from the producer receipts level in August but it represents a decrease of 6.82 percent when compared to the producer receipts level of September 2007.

Producer milk classified as Class I during September amounted to 39.79 percent of total producer receipts. This figure is up from 37.04 percent in August and it is up from 34.55 percent in September 2007. The average butterfat test of producer milk pooled during September was 3.589 percent, average protein test was 3.033 percent, average other solids test was 5.730 percent and the average somatic cell count was 300.000.

JULY FLUID MILK SALES

During July, about 4.3 billion pounds of packaged fluid milk products is estimated to have been sold in the United States. This was 0.7 percent higher than July 2007. After adjusting for calendar composition, sales in July 2008 were 0.6 percent lower than July 2007. On an individual product basis, after adjusting for calendar composition, sales of organic whole milk, reduced fat milk (2%), low fat milk (1%), and organic fat-reduced milk increased from July 2007, while sales of whole milk, flavored whole milk, fat-free (skim) milk, flavored fat-reduced milk, and buttermilk decreased from a year earlier. 


